

#### TRANSITING THE PANAMA CANAL

Daylight crossings gives you an uncommon glimpse of the Panama Canal. The impressive mechanics float the ship through locks at multiple elevations, leisurely moving from one end of the Canal to the other. Glide from dynamic port cities into remote countryside and farmlands before exiting to another modern cityscape, seeing yesterday and today in rare fashion.

#### FUERTE AMADOR (PANAMA CITY), PANAMA

Where the Panama Canal joins the Pacific sits the capital city of Fuerte Amador. More commonly known as Panama City, this overnight port offers insight into the Canal's history, the city's time as a Spanish fort and its present-day role as a major shipping destination and global center of research, business, and entertainment.

#### MANTA (QUITO), ECUADOR

Manta's extensive port is a world center for tuna and other fishing, as well as banana agriculture, and its beaches attract surfers and windsurfers worldwide. From here, you can visit the national capital of Quito, a pleasant Spanish colonial UNESCO World Heritage Site located right on the Equator, scenically situated among Andean peaks at over 9,500 feet (2,896 meters).


#### ISLAS GUAÑAPE, PERU

A cluster of four tiny islands off the coast of Peru are uninhabited by people, but are teeming with wildlife – particularly seabirds such as Humboldt penguins, blue-footed boobies, terns, and southern sea lions who frequent these protected lands and waters.

#### CALLAO (LIMA), PERU

Visit Lima, the "City of Kings" and a UNESCO World Heritage Site, prized for its grand palaces and churches, broad plazas, and unique style of art that blends classical forms with native traditions.







Pisco dates from 1640, its Plaza de Armas is a Spanish colonial treasure. Another treasure are the Ballestas Islands, an offshore cluster of rocky outcroppings teeming with seabirds, penguins, sea lions, dolphins, and other wildlife.

#### SAN ANTONIO (SANTIAGO), CHILE

This large, modern port serves Chile's capital, Santiago, a city with Spanish colonial charm and a vivacious spirit. Encircled by the Andes and the Coastal Range, Santiago is centered around the Plaza de Armas, with several of the city's landmarks: the 18th-century Metropolitan Cathedral the Palacio de la Real Audiencia from 1808, the City Hall, and the National Museum of History.

#### PUERTO MONTT, CHILE

Captivating volcanic peaks, Chilean fjords, a vibrant fish market and harbor, and a bustling town-like atmosphere are all part of the colorful experience. Explore white-water rafting, fly-fishing and hiking, or meander through craft stalls of handmade goods as you discover this multifaceted Pacific port.

#### PUNTA ARENAS, CHILE

Punta Arenas is the most important port and commercial center for the immense Patagonian agricultural area of Chile. The economy revolves around the sheep raised on the expansive pampas. Located on the Strait of Magellan separating the mainland from the island of Tierra del Fuego, the city proclaims itself the southernmost city in the world.







#### SYDNEY, AUSTRALIA

#### BRISBANE, AUSTRALIA

#### CAIRNS, AUSTRALIA

#### BENOA (DENPASAR), BALI, INDONESIA



Magong is the largest of the 90 islands and islets that make up the Penghu archipelago in the Taiwan Strait. Recently, the islands were designated a National Scenic Area and Penghu's historic attractions are becoming better known.

#### KEELUNG (TAIPEI), TAIWAN

Keelung is the second largest port in Taiwan. However, the main reason for traveling here is to visit the contemporary metropolis of Taipei.

#### MIYAKOJIMA (HIRARA), MIYAKO ISLAND, JAPAN

Miyako Island is said to be Japan's most beautiful. Yonaha Maehama Beach is for swimmers, while Yoshino has coral reefs and the white-sand Sunayama has rock formations.

#### TIANJIN (BEIJING), CHINA

Tianjin is the largest and most important seaport in Northern China and the main marine gateway to the capital of the People's Republic at Beijing. The actual municipality of Tianjin is a short way inland.

#### BUSAN (PUSAN), SOUTH KOREA

#### FUKUOKA (HAKATA), JAPAN

Hakata attractions for visitors include a park surrounding the ruins of the samurai Fukuoka Castle. The Genko Historical Museum holds displays of Japanese and Mongol armor from the period of the Mongol invasions.

#### HIROSHIMA, JAPAN

The city was established in the 16th century and although it was an important city throughout the imperial period, its reputation was burned into history when it became the first civilian target of an atomic bombing. Relics of its past such as the impressive Hiroshima Castle were rebuilt, and the city undertook the construction of a Memorial Peace Park, which today attracts visitors from around the world.

#### DUTCH HARBOR, UNALASKA, ALASKA

Dutch Harbor is a well-protected natural harbor on Amaknak Island in the Fox Islands group, located about halfway along the volcanic arc of the Aleutian Islands in the Bering Sea. Being ice-free, it is a vital port for the Bering Sea fishing industry.

#### KODIAK, KODIAK ISLAND, ALASKA

Alaska's largest island and the second largest in the US. Fishing is a popular draw for visitors, but they also are attracted by opportunities to view and photograph local birds and wildlife, including the island's massive brown bears.

#### SITKA, ALASKA

This is the place where the purchase of Alaska from Russia was completed. The copper-domed St. Michael's Cathedral bespeaks Sitka's Russian heritage. The New Archangel Dancers keep colorful traditions alive.

#### KETCHIKAN, ALASKA

Ketchikan is the salmon capital of the world. The largest collection of traditional Native American totem poles in the world is at Totem Bight State Park, Potlatch Park, Saxman Native Village and the Totem Heritage Center.


#### GOLFO ARANCI, SARDINIA, ITALY


The Sardinian coastline is serrated by deep-cut coves of sparkling sea, surrounded by rocky prominences and edged in lovely strands of beach. The Aga Khan fell in love with the place, and dubbed it the Costa Smeralda, creating a magnet for the global glitterati, who adore its silvery white sands.

#### ST. TROPEZ, FRANCE

The modern glamour never really deserts this town famous for Bardot and a film festival, but the venerable village perché of Grimaud in the nearby Maures Massif has an 11th-century Grimaud Castle with links to Monaco's ruling Grimaldis.







#### MÁLAGA (GRANADA), SPAIN

The birthplace of Pablo Picasso, Málaga wine, and a style of flamenco, Málaga is an incredibly interesting glimpse at life in southern Spain through the ages. First settled by the Phoenicians, Málaga has been a capital of many dynasties, as evidenced by two Moorish fortresses still standing today.

#### LEIXÕES (PORTO), PORTUGAL

The commercial center of northern Portugal and hub of the port wine trade, Porto is a gracious, cosmopolitan city noted for its 12th-century cathedral and medieval churches, picturesque narrow streets, wine lodges at Vila Nova de Gaia and hidden Baroque treasures.

#### ROUEN (PARIS), FRANCE

Among the most popular cities of outer Paris, Rouen, the "City of a Hundred Spires," is home to the Cathedrale Notre-Dame, the Gros-Horloge Renaissance clock, the Place du Vieux Marche and enduring medieval ambience.

#### HAMBURG, GERMANY

Free spirited, artsy and diverse Hamburg is an eclectic city where you can relax in lovely parks one minute, browse an outdoor market the next, take in live theatre or comedy, or stroll red-brick canals all in the same day.

#### GDAŃSK, POLAND

A monument to strength and perseverance, Gdańsk has wavered between Poland and Germany for centuries. The historic Old City has been rebuilt since World War II and offers a look at the city's past, present and future.

#### TALLINN, ESTONIA

Ivory stone walls, cobblestone streets, red-roofed towers, windmills and a Gothic Revival Cathedral make Tallinn feel like a gateway into medieval times that's seamlessly blended with modernday enjoyments.

#### VISBY, SWEDEN

Often called the City of Roses, the namesake flowers bloom nearly all year, framing 17 medieval churches, the Old Apothecary, museums with Viking rune stones and artifacts, sandy beaches, wild cliffs and rolling pastures.

A unique self-governing island in the Irish Sea, the Isle of Man is a melting pot of character with stunning natural landscapes, unspoiled beaches, nature reserves, historic churches, diverse museums and nautical exhibits.

#### BELFAST, NORTHERN IRELAND

Belfast's center is an attractive place with street musicians and a revitalized river front. Visit Titanic Belfast, the star-shaped repository of all things RMS *Titanic*.

The Westman Islands are among Nature's youngest geologic creations. Heimaey's shape and size were drastically changed by a 1973 eruption. 




